# FROM OUR RABBI



As we enter the season of introspecttion and preparation for the High Holy Days, we often think about how we should live our individual and communal lives. I have a friend who often repeats a variation of the story below.

The story tells us . . . One day a man had a conversation with God and said. "Dear God, I would like to know what heaven and hell are like?" God led the man to two doors, he opened the first one and let the man look inside. In the room there was a large round table and in the middle of the table was a large pot of stew that smelled delicious. However, the people around the table were thin and sickly, and they seemed to be very hungry. The man then noticed they had very long spoons tied to their hands, it was possible for everyone to reach out and get the food from the pan but because the spoons were longer than their arms, they could not bring the spoons to their mouths. The man shuddered at the sight of their misery and suffering. God said, "Now you have seen hell," and they went to the next room. God opened the door and the room was exactly the same as the first one, there was also a large round table in the middle of the room containing a large pot of stew. The people had exactly the same long spoons attached to their arms, but these people were well nourished and healthy. They had fun and were laughing and talking with each other. The man said, "I do not get it. I do not get it!" God said. "It's pretty simple, you only need to know one thing. You see, they have learned to feed each other, while the greedy people only think of themselves. (Unknown)

The moral of the story in this period of introspection can be seen as a parable to the well-known quote "United we stand, divided we fall. (John Dicknison "The Liberty Song"). In other words, we will only reach "heaven" (unity and health) when we come together to support one another. Otherwise we will sink into the mud of greed, ego and individualism, this being a place where we will never find the nourishment needed to sustain life.

In terms of individualism and caring for the community, we would need to ask ourselves what kind of driver are we? Do we drive in the hope of helping others or only caring about our own cars? The answer to this for each of us should be found in the lesson from the following story:

A young and successful executive was traveling down a neighborhood street, going a bit too fast in his brand new Jaguar. He was watching for kids darting out from between parked cars and slowed. As his car passed, no children appeared. Instead, a brick smashed into the Jag's side door! He slammed on the brakes and spun the Jag back to the spot where the brick had been thrown

He jumped out of the car, grabbed a kid and pushed him up against a parked car shouting, "What was that all about and who are you? Just what the heck are you doing?" Building up a head of steam he went on. That's a \$65,000 new car and that brick you threw is going to cost a lot of money. Why did you do it?"

"Please mister, please I'm sorry, I didn't know what else to do," pleaded the youngster. "I threw the brick because no one else would stop . . ." Tears were dripping down the boy's chin as he pointed around the parked car. "It's my brother," he said. "He rolled off the curb and fell out off his wheelchair and I can't lift him up."

Sobbing, the boy asked the executive, "Would you please help me get him back into his wheelchair? He's hurt and he's too heavy for me."

Moved beyond words, the driver tried to swallow the rapidly swelling lump in his throat. He lifted the young man back into the wheelchair and took out his handkerchief and wiped the scrapes and cuts, checking to see that everything was going to be okay.

"Thank you and may God bless you," the grateful child said to him.

The man then watched the little boy push his brother down the sidewalk toward their home. It was a long walk back to his Jaguar . . . a long slow walk.

He never did repair the side door. He kept the dent to remind him not to go through life so fast that someone has to throw a brick at you to get your attention. (Author Unknown)

It is my hope and prayer that we will all find the qualities of heaven on earth and drive with the remembrance that we are part of the highway of life and not alone on the path towards nowhere. For the way we think and answer the questions above will be the way we greet 5779.

Shalom. We are off to a good start for 2018-2019 (5778-5779) at CAS. So much is happening and so much is planned.

Most people feel that time accelerates as they age. Years seem to pass by much more quickly when you reach 50 or above compared to your teenage years. While only 2 months have already passed since the CAS Annual Meeting, I already feel that we are behind schedule. In reality, we have accomplished many significant things and have a bright future ahead.

The trip to Israel was fantastic thanks to the hard work and detailed planning provided by Rabbi Bloom. Hats-off to Michal Bloom for enhancing our bus rides with daily Hebrew mini-lessons, commentary, singing and enthusiasm. Back in Fort Worth, members of the new Executive Committee and new Board of Directors have met and are working well together. These leaders, along with our Committee Chairs, are systematically reviewing our operations and addressing significant issues. A few other highlights:

- The Education Committee is seeking input from both teachers and parents about our Religious School program while planning a great school year.
- Cantor Andres Levy has been hired to help lead services during the High Holy Days. Cantor Levy will also be part of a concert on Sunday, September 16.
- The search for a new Cantor and Education Director has identified several good candidates. In the interim, weekday morning, weekday evening and Shabbat services are occurring as usual thanks to our Ritual Committee, Rabbi Bloom and a team of volunteers.
- A financial audit is underway intended to validate our Treasurer's financial reports and identify improvements in our operations.
- A Board Retreat is planned for August 26 to help align our thinking, develop a clear mission and identify our short and long-term goals.
- We "closed" the land sale transaction on July 17, yielding \$6,808,882.92
  - ° Gross Price = \$6,850,000.00
  - ° Plus \$40,000.00 (Fort Worth ISD Reimbursement for Expenses)
  - ° Minus \$34,250.00 (Transwestern Commercial Services, LLC)
  - ° Minus \$46,867.08 (Barlow, Garsek and Simon, LLP)

I am thankful for the help of our staff and clergy (Michael Linn, Rabbi Bloom, Suzi Gardner and JoAnn English) and our Board. I am also thankful to the many congregants who have raised their hands and offered their help to me and the congregation. If you have a programming idea or a suggestion to improve CAS, please contact me directly. Overall, we have a great opportunity to make changes that will enhance the organization.

# FROM OUR EXECUTIVE IRECTOR

I do not profess to be a religious individual and I am not certain what, if anything, awaits me when I shuckle off this mortal coil. I am, to an extent, what may be described as an observant Jew, when those tenets of Judaism are convenient. I am however, an individual that is very much


aware of tradition and history. It is the traditions and customs of Judaism that I hold most dear.

I have heard the stories from many individuals of late that have journeyed to Israel. These comments brought back memories of the trip that Pat and I had made a number of years ago. All voyages to Israel reach Jerusalem, and we spent three rain soaked days touching, tasting, visiting and wandering through this magnificent city before we went to the "wall". Traveling underground, running after our tour guide, we finally found ourselves once again, outside. The rain had stopped, we were breathing clean air, and unexpectedly, standing silently, majestically, was the Western and Southern outer wall. The sun highlighted the soaked courtyard with only a handful of people standing about. There were three men davening at the wall. I walked, with members of our group towards the "wall" but my progress slowed as I looked up at the wall, watched the back of others, and stared at the stone. I finally touched the wall. I saw all the tiny pieces of paper shoved into every crack and crevice and noted that some of the ink was crying. I felt the stones, smoothed by thousands of caressing hands. I don't know what I had expected, but the stone had a rose hue and was hand polished and so cool to the touch. I remember standing there feeling almost a part of the wall itself. I slowly tuned away and started walking back to rejoin our group. I noticed two other members of the group that had walked near me, not with me, as we all seemed to walk alone, start to walk toward the group. For some unexplained reason something caused me to stop, to halt my plodding footsteps and slowly return to the wall. I noticed my two new friends also walking back to the wall. Not one word was exchanged, and I wonder if we realized what we had done. I found a different spot at the wall this time. The stone was still wet, cold and smooth. I was able to reach up and touch something growing in the wall. Something green was growing in the cracks with a myriad of notes surrounding it. I placed my face against the wall and felt the tears on my cheek mingle with fallen droplets of rain still glistening on the stone. To this day, I cannot explain my feelings, the exhibition of emotion or the pull emanating from the wall. Maybe my soul, my being, was responding to an ancient call. I cannot nor will I, attempt to answer my own questions. But I did move slowly away, as did my friends. We said nothing to each other but we were communicating, with each other and with the wall, and watched as the sun was again hiding and rain was about to revisit the wall.

Something lives within the wall, it is an undeniable part of us. It is something that will keep pulling at us through all eternity. It was an experience that had left me at peace with myself. If you have visited Israel, you may know what I had been feeling. If you have not been to Israel, it is time to consider such a venture.
