FROM OUR RABBI



Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur have come and gone, but their lessons are eternal. Those lessons that we discussed this Yom Kippur had to do with being judgmental and honest. On the one hand we looked at how being judgmental leads to disunity and disunity leads to destruction. While on

the other hand we spoke about how honesty brings about integrity and integrity leads to prosperity. Thus, we concluded that honesty and integrity are the foundations for a good life and prosperous community.

One of the centerpieces of this discussion or to be more precise my sermon, was a story about a retiring CEO, a boiled seed and a young executive named Jim. The story itself centered around honesty and integrity. Several congregants requested that I publish the story so that we could continue the discussion on this important and relevant topic. The story goes:

"How One CEO Taught His Employees A Lesson in Integrity"

A successful business man was growing old and knew it was time to choose a successor to take over the business. Instead of choosing one of his Directors or his children, he decided to do something different. He called all the young executives in his company together. He said, "It is time for me to step down and choose the next CEO. I have decided to choose one of you. " The young executives were shocked, but the boss continued. "I am going to give each one of you a SEED today – one very special SEED... I want you to plant the seed, water it, and come back here one year from today with what you have grown from the seed I have given you. I will then judge the plants that you bring, and the one I choose will be the next CEO." One man, named Jim, was there that day and he, like the others, received a seed. He went home and excitedly, told his wife the story. She helped him get a pot, soil and compost and he planted the seed. Every day, he would water it and watch to see if it had grown. After about three weeks, some of the other executives began to talk about their seeds and the plants that were beginning to grow. Jim kept checking his seed, but nothing ever grew. Three weeks, four weeks, five weeks went by, still nothing. By now, others were talking about their plants, but Jim didn't have a plant and he felt like a failure. Six months went by - still nothing in Jim's pot. He just knew he had killed his seed. Everyone else had trees and tall plants, but he had nothing. Jim didn't say anything to his colleagues, however.

He just kept watering and fertilizing the soil – He so wanted the seed to grow. A year finally went by and all the young executives of the company brought their plants to the CEO for inspection. Jim told his wife that he wasn't going to take an empty pot. But she asked him to be honest about what happened. Jim felt sick to his stomach, it was going to be the most embarrassing moment of his life, but he knew his wife was right. He took his empty pot to the board room. When Jim arrived, he was amazed at the variety of plants grown by the other executives. They were beautiful - in all shapes and sizes. Jim put his empty pot on the floor and many of his colleagues laughed, a few felt sorry for him! When the CEO arrived, he surveyed the room and greeted his young executives. Jim just tried to hide in the back. "My, what great plants, trees, and flowers you have grown," said the CEO. "Today one of you will be appointed the next CEO!" Suddenly, the CEO spotted Jim at the back of the room with his empty pot. He ordered the Financial Director to bring him to the front. Jim was terrified. He thought, "The CEO knows I'm a failure! Maybe he will have me fired!" When Jim got to the front, the CEO asked him what had happened to his seed -Jim told him the story. The CEO asked everyone to sit down except Jim. He looked at Jim, and then announced to the young executives, "Behold your next Chief Executive Officer! His name is Jim!" Jim couldn't believe it. Jim couldn't even grow his seed. "How could he be the new CEO?" the others said. Then the CEO said, "One year ago today, I gave everyone in this room a seed. I told you to take the seed, plant it, water it, and bring it back to me today. But I gave you all boiled seeds; they were dead – it was not possible for them to grow. All of you, except Jim, have brought me trees and plants and flowers. When you found that the seed would not grow, you substituted another seed for the one I gave you. Jim was the only one with the courage and honesty to bring me a pot with my seed in it. Therefore, he is the one who will be the new Chief Executive Officer!"

- If you plant honesty, you will reap trust
- ♦ If you plant goodness, you will reap friends
- If you plant humility, you will reap greatness
- If you plant perseverance, you will reap contentment
- If you plant consideration, you will reap perspective
- ♦ If you plant hard work, you will reap success
- If you plant forgiveness, you will reap reconciliation
- ♦ If you plant faith in God, you will reap a harvest

So, be careful what you plant now; it will determine what you will reap later.

"Whatever You Give To Life, Life Gives You Back"

As we can see the results of the foundation that Jim and his wife built gave rise to positive results for them while at the same time teaching a lesson to the company and society.

In the days, weeks, months and years ahead we will be faced with individual and communal decisions on how to lead our lives, and it is my hope and prayer that we will all act like Jim when the ultimate CEO of life (God) puts us through the test.

Let's highlight a few recent, meaningful and important events:

- High Holiday services were wonderful. Congratulations and thank you to all those who organized and led services. The list is long and includes Rabbi Bloom, Cantor Andres Levy (great voice!), Ben Herman, Harold Malofsky, Harry Labovitz, the CAS Men's Club (led by Dan Sturman), Michael Linn, Suzie Gardner, Cameron Chrestensen, our Torah readers and those honored with responsibilities on the bimah. Seamless execution!
- The President's Award for Volunteer of the Year was presented to the Focus of the Future Committee: Marvin Beleck, Rhoda Bernstein, Steven Brown, Dr. Murray Cohen, Naomi Rosenfield and the catalyst, Lou Barnett. The Committee's fine work resulted in the very favorable conclusion to our multi-year effort to sell our excess land.
- The CAS Education and Engagement Center opened our Sunday religious school on September 23. The CAS Men's Club hosted an opening day breakfast for parents and students. There is a long list of people to thank starting with Rivka Marco, Rebecca Isgur, Rabbi Bloom, the entire Education Committee, our dedicated teachers and teaching support staff.

With the revitalized education program launched and the High Holidays behind us, our focus will turn to three important initiatives:

- **Finances:** We need to approve a balanced budget for the fiscal year that begins November 1, 2018. The budget is essentially a formal promise that we will meet all well-defined financial commitments over the next 12 months. The current plan is to cut spending and increase income. I want to thank the Board of Directors, the Investment and Endowment Committee and the Budget and Finance Committee for their analysis of the problem, creativity and dedication. Perhaps most importantly, the teamwork has been outstanding.
- Committees, Programs and Membership: With our Committee Chairs and Committee Members in place, it's time to implement. In the next few months we will see many new, fun, educational and engaging programs designed for children, adults or families. I don't want to over-promise but the future is bright. I am looking forward to rolling out the many new initiatives being considered by the Membership Committee and other committees.

 - Beginning, October 7, 2018 at 9:30 am, please join us as we launch our weekly "Bagels and Smooze" program in the Barnett Lounge. (Can someone recommend a better, creative name?)
- New Building / Renovations: The time has arrived to address the long-term future. The stage is set: the land sale is completed, we have money in the bank, we are addressing our upcoming budget, revitalizing our committees and increasing our programs. In 2016 2018 we gathered lots of information from members concerning the current building and what congregants would like to see in a new facility. In the next 30 days we will start the next steps: setting up key committees and planning the future. It will be a very complex process. Be assured that the input of all congregants will be frequently solicited. More news soon.

GENERAL INFORMATION

IRS Required Minimum Distributions

The IRS mandates that you begin taking money out of your IRA at age 70 1/2 which increases your taxable income and may even push you into a higher tax bracket.

Opportunity to Reduce Taxable Income

Consider directing your mandated distribution from your IRA to support Congregation Ahavath Sholom. Your gift will not be counted as income. The IRS will consider your required minimum distribution fulfilled and you may save thousands in higher taxes.

Requirements

- You must be of 70 1/2 years old.
- The transfer must be paid directly from your IRA to Congregation Ahavath Sholom.
- The gift cannot exceed \$100,000 in 2018. Married spouses can combine their gifts and can contribute \$200,000.
- The gift must be outright, but it can be used to satisfy existing pledges.
