FROM OUR RABBI



We often look backwards and ask ourselves, "What could I have done differently and where would I be if I had?" It would seem that we spend an

enormous amount of time looking backwards even as time continues to move forward.

When pondering this "looking forward to the past" phenomena I am reminded of the words of Walt Disney. There is no disputing that Disney changed the world of entertainment as has the company built upon his name today. The motto that Walt Disney lived by was, "We keep moving forward, opening new doors, and doing new things, because we're curious and curiosity keeps leading us down new paths." These words can and should serve as our roadmap to life. For we can't change the past but we can live in the present and use our curiosity to influence the future. Thus we would end up looking towards the future instead of the past.

Additionally, looking backwards to the past is often stressful. We feel this stress in our personal, communal and national lives. It even at times paralyzes our energy throughout the day. For once again, we are looking backwards and thus becoming paralyzed by what has happened to us. How do we deal with such stress and a backwards way of looking at our lives?

Theologically we can begin by remembering the words in the Book of Proverbs, "Fools give full vent to their rage, but the wise bring calm in the end." (Proverbs 29:11) In other words we must not give in to our rage and stress, but rather we need to invest in our inner calm. While this may be difficult we must remember that the advice that King Solomon gave in Proverbs has been guiding our lives for thousands of years.

Furthermore, we must also remember that "stressed" spelled backwards is "desserts":)

While I am not suggesting that we eat our way out of stress, I am saying that we need to embrace the sweetness and the taste of a good dessert as the roadmap forward to inner calmness. Just like a good dessert brings a smile to our face, so too can calmness bring a smile to our soul. For when we combine our inner calm with the taste of the sweetness of a good dessert I have no doubt that our stress will melt away and goodness will take its place.

Finally, we must stop litigating what has already been decided. Rather, let us seek a future that opens doors to what can be. Let us build the theme parks of life while opening the doors of future enjoyment. Imagine how much more fulfilling life would be if we began living instead of being stuck in our past regrets. I hope we can all become the visionaries that Disney was, for if we do then we will build a better future for ourselves and our children.

GENERAL INFORMATION

IRS Required Minimum Distributions

The IRS mandates that you begin taking money out of your IRA at age 70 1/2 which increases your taxable income and may even push you into a higher tax bracket.

Opportunity to Reduce Taxable Income

Consider directing your mandated distribution from your IRA to support Congregation Ahavath Sholom. Your gift will not be counted as income. The IRS will consider your required minimum distribution fulfilled and you may save thousands in higher taxes.

Requirements

- You must be of 70 1/2 years old.
- The transfer must be paid directly from your IRA to Congregation Ahavath Sholom.
- The gift cannot exceed \$100,000 in 2018. Married spouses can combine their gifts and can contribute \$200,000.
- The gift must be outright, but it can be used to satisfy existing pledges.


FORT WORTH AND TARRANT COUNTY JEWISH FAMILY SERVICES

The service is available, free of charge, for persons without need for a special mobility device as well as those who use mobility devices such as a walker or a motorized wheelchair.

If you would like to register to participate, please contact Lynell Bond, case manager, at 817-823-0476. Once you have enrolled in the program, you will need to schedule appointments at least 48 hours in advance.

We want everyone in our community to know about the transportation to medical appointments so they can participate if needed. B'nai B'rith Christmas Tradition

For over 35 years B'nai B'rith has served meals and provided gifts for the homeless on Christmas in Fort Worth.

Every year 50 - 70 volunteers from CAS, Beth Israel and Beth-El, along with members of the Christian community, join together for this special annual event.

It's at Beautiful Feet Ministries in Southeast Fort Worth, a Christian organization that serves the poor and the needy. On Christmas Day 50 - 70 volunteers take over and cook and serve a hot breakfast, a hot lunch and distribute toys, clothing and toiletries collected throughout the year.

Each year 100 - 150 homeless guests have their day brightened when the Tarrant County Jewish community works side-by-side to help those in need.

B'nai B'rith has a good supply of toys, but is in urgent need of donated toiletries and new clothes such as socks, sweatshirts, underwear, gloves, caps, shirts, etc. for men and women. L, XL and XXL large are always in short supply.


