# FROM OUR RABBI



Our alarm goes off, we head to the bathroom, shower, get dressed, have coffee and our day has started. However, how often in our morning rush do we stop and give thanks for our being able to begin our days at all?

Judaism mandates two centering Blessings grouped together as one, which are called Asher Yatzar (translates loosely into God creating us) whereby we do take a moment to give thanks. All of us reading this, have reasons to give thanks, and thus let us start our days (irrespective of our individual faiths) by thanking God. The prayers below are for both the body and soul.

## Prayer for Body

Blessed are You, Hashem, our God, King of the Universe, Who formed man with wisdom and created many openings and cavities within him. It is obvious and known before Your throne of glory that if any one of them were closed or if one of any one them were opened, it would be impossible to exist for even an hour [i.e., a short while]. Blessed are You, Hashem, Who heals all flesh and does wondrous things.

## Prayer for Soul

My God, the soul that you placed within me is pure. You created it, You formed it, You breathed it into me, and You preserve it within me. And in the future, You will take it from me and restore it in the Time to Come. All the time that this soul is within me, I am thankful before You, Hashem, my God and the God of my fathers, Ruler of all creation, Lord of all the souls. Blessed are You, Hashem, Who restores souls to dead bodies.

What about the rest of our day? We have given thanks. What's next? First we must understand that we can't go back and fix or live in the the past, but we can make the present and the future a better place for ourselves, families, community and society!

How can we do this? The answer is simple even though the effort is great. We must look forwards and leave past behind us. Why? Because "Life moves on and so should we." (Spencer Johnson) In other words, there is no way that we can stop time or motion and thus only two choices face us. We can get rolled over or we can progress forward.

In chapter 12 of the Book of Genesis, God speaks to Avram, commanding him, "Go from your land, from your birthplace and from your father's house, to the land which I will show you." Avram faced two choices; move forward with God or get left behind by time, place and God. Avram decided to move forward, for as Spencer mentioned, "life moves on" and so did Avram. We know that due to Avram's decision we live in a Monotheistic society today.

Thus, let us say our blessings in the morning and listen to the advice of Spencer throughout our day, while at the same time living the example of Avram. For through this, we will be able to live in the present instead of remembering how we lived in the past.

May God accept our prayers, and may we use our time wisely.

# PRESIDENT'S DESK

Shalom. I wish you a healthy and happy New Year. There is a flurry of activity to report as we begin 5780. Please refer to the separate list of upcoming events. Come join us!

I receive lots of questions and comments from Congregants. Collecting and dealing with this input is an important facet of the position of President. For this month's column, I will discuss one important topic that is frequently the subject of attention.

Let's discuss our progress concerning the Building Project. In March 2019, we convened the first meeting of the Exploratory Building Committee. This Committee was charged with identifying an architectural firm that could help us make a decision on our options and potentially develop a superb design. Our choices include building a new building, renovating the current building or doing nothing at all. The Committee was NOT charged with making a decision on these options since this will be left to a congregational vote.

In July, a request for qualifications (RFQ) was developed and sent to 16 architectural firms. Eight responses to the RFQ were received and evaluated by the Committee. In October, four firms will visit CAS to present their proposals. We are looking for an experienced firm with a good reputation; a firm with experience building aesthetically appealing synagogues that are ecologically friendly, economical, welcoming and have flexible spaces. We are looking for a firm that will work well with CAS and include input provided by the Congregation. At the end of this selection process, a larger committee system will be developed to work on our options.

If we choose to build or renovate in the near future, multiple committees will be required for the many facets of building construction. There will be many many volunteer opportunities.

Finally, let me clearly state that we have not spent any of the money derived from the sale of our excess land. There is over \$6.5 million dollars in a low risk account waiting for our decisions.

I want to thank the Committee members: Mike Reznikoff (Chair), Rabbi Bloom, Arnold Gachman, Ben Herman, Stephen Kaye, Rick Savitz.

## SECURITY ANNOUNCEMENT

If you have ever flown on a plane, you are aware and accustomed to the announcement on how to use a seat belt, the emergency oxygen and the location of all the exits.

Safety and security within CAS are everyone's responsibility. Should there be a need to evacuate the building, please immediately follow the direction of Police, Rabbi, Executive Director or Board President.

If these individuals direct you to evacuate the building, please immediately follow the directions. Offer to assist others, but if they are not leaving, do not hesitate to exit yourself and do not worry about personal items.

We have established a **Rally Point**, the parking lot of the library if you can do so safely. If not, head south to the First Command building. First responders will verify who is at the Rally Point and if you are not there, it will be assumed that you are still in the building.

Take a moment and visualize the **exits**: There is an emergency exit in the glass wall of the chapel; there are exits near the sanctuary, and the school, and there is an exit at the south end of the building within the school wing. In addition, there are two exits (east and west) near the kitchen, and an exit from the Zale that leads to the area close to the flag pole.

**FIRE**: If there is a fire, the alarm will sound and signal lights will flash. There is a fire alarm pull station at the exit doors, and fire extinguishers located throughout the building. There are staff and members that are aware of the various emergency buttons.

**Medical**: There is an oxygen tank in the foyer, next to the entrance to the hall leading to the bimah. An AED is located opposite the synagogue office and a first aid kit is located in the area of the copy machine. Wheelchairs are located next to the kitchen in the Northeast part of the building.

**POWER FAILURE**: There is emergency lighting throughout the building that will turn on when there is a power failure.

**OTHER EMERGENCY**: Staff and some members are aware of the location of various emergency buttons throughout the building. Should there be a need to utilize this system, or to protect from severe weather, you will be given specific directions to either shelter in place (Run-Hide-Fight) or to evacuate the building. Should evacuation be necessary, remember the Rally Point.

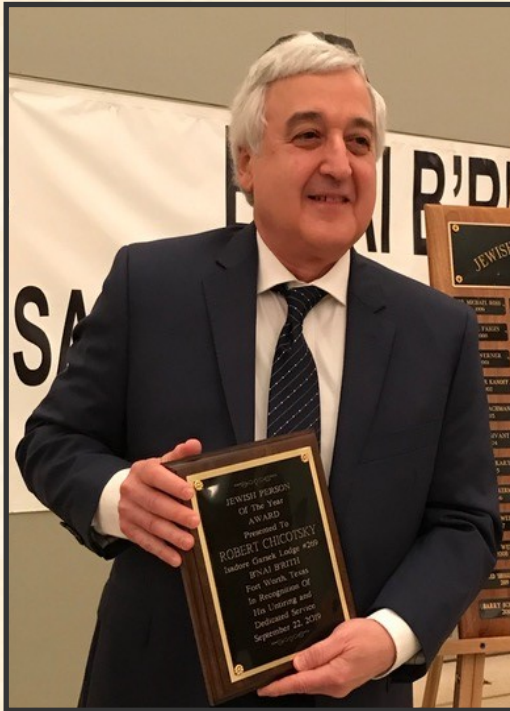

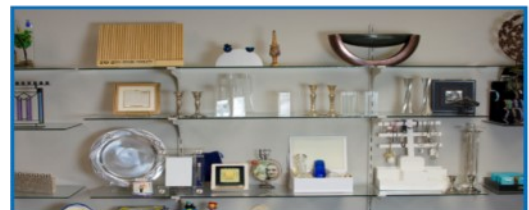
