FROM OUR RABBI



We often pray for calm waters in the times ahead. For who wants to be on a ship in rough waters? I can tell you that the one time we were on a cruise, I was

very happy that the ocean was calm. However, calming waters are not always in front of us. The perfect example being the COVID-19 tempest that we still find ourselves in. The question being, how do we deal with such a "tempest"?

Undoubtedly, Helen Keller dealt with many "tempests" that tested her character throughout her lifetime. Upon being asked about this, she said, "Character cannot be developed in ease and quiet. Only through experience of trial and suffering can the soul be strengthened, ambition inspired, and success achieved." (Helen Keller)

Although Keller is not alive today, her words are as fitting for our present circumstances as they were when she wrote them. Although "The best time to plant a tree was 20 years ago. The second-best time is now." (Chinese Proverb) In other words, this ancient Proverb tells us that we can't look backward to define who we are today. Rather, we must plant our trees of character at this moment in time. Thus, helping to plant the life-sustaining moral forest for future generations to come.

Speaking of trees and finding joy in our present circumstances, thus finding calm waters, I enjoy sitting in my backyard and birdwatching. They are now coming back. I enjoy watching the Cardinals and Blue Jays feast upon the Safflower seeds in my birdfeeders. However, for birds to stay on the feeders for more than a few seconds, there needs to be silence. Thereby, you not only need

to be silent when watching them, but you also have to become a part of that silence. In other words, the calm waters that I mentioned above.

Interestingly enough, watching birds and the silence of those moments has allowed me to see God from a different perspective. I am not talking about seeing God in the beauty of the birds, although that is true. Rather, I am speaking about just listening and observing, instead of talking and constantly being on the move. It is during these quiet moments we can find the inner meaning of the world around us and God within us. This is why the Amidah (one of the two central foundational groups of prayers in Judaism) is recited silently. It allows us to pray, listen, and communicate with God on a deeper level. In essence, we are finding God by becoming one with the universe; instead of conquering the universe.

I read a quote the other day when I was trying to find some new bird feeders on Amazon to purchase. The quote said, "The reason birds can fly and we can't is simply because they have perfect faith, for to have faith is to have wings." (J.M. Barrie) I think that this quote is appropriate. To truly believe and heighten our spirituality, we must have faith and allow our inner prayers to fly towards heaven. Let us pray that the day ahead brings the beauty of a Cardinal and the quiet of life into our individual lives. Thereby, our sailing through life will truly be on calm waters.



Happy June! As I write this, we are in mid-May. I can share that your staff and Board of Directors have put a few pieces in place to keep CAS on the front line of adaptation to life during and after COVID-19 and moving forward. As more of us are fully vaccinated, the CDC guidelines will change what we can do. My goal is to be back



to better-than-before when the new school year begins. Here's what we are doing to transition forward:

The Membership Committee provided Coffee Under the Canopy on Sundays in May (except Mother's Day) with coffee and cookies. The hope was to create a comfortable setting for conversation while meeting members and potential members in their routine.

Situational Awareness and Countering Active Threat training were held on Zoom. As our stores and neighborhoods begin to come to life, we need to be mindful of our surroundings and ways we can negate personal and community threats. The Programming Committee's work with the Secure Community Network gave us the resources to do that. I hope you were able to tune in.

Rockin' Ruach Drive-In service, scheduled for April 23, moved indoors due to weather and happened outdoors on May 14. Challah was given to each family/vehicle in attendance for both. The Neshemah band is always good.

The Board of Directors approved the cost of outfitting the Chapel for Zoom services. Once that is complete, we will move daily Minyanim services into the Chapel. The goal is to move Shabbat services to the Chapel once we need less physical distancing. Stay tuned for more information on that!

Kiddush Lunch on May 29 will be to-go boxes. Tables will be set up outdoors for dining, conversing, and sharing to-gether. For those not quite ready to dine together, the lunch can be taken home. The hope is to continue this type of Kiddush Lunch until we are able to set up the meal inside. Sponsors are needed.

The Men's Club and Ladies' Auxiliary are working together to refresh the lobby. What a great update and a difference we will notice in how this space can be utilized. If the plans are any indication, it will be transformed!

Our **Annual Meeting is June 6 at 4 pm on Zoom**. Information is in this bulletin. If you need additional informaton, please let me know. I want to be sure you have everything you need to participate.

I know we all want to return to what was before. This pandemic offers us an opportunity to be more and better. Can you believe that as you read this article the school year will be over?

Our last month, May, included the following fun and meaningful activities at the school:

Mother's Day: We celebrated our Ema's by writing poems

about her, learning how to say "Mom, I love you" in Hebrew, writing "Ema, ani ohev/et ohtach" in Hebrew, and making a painting for Ema to enjoy this poem and sentence on a canvas.

In addition, Rich and Terri Hollander made bagels for a boxed lunch for Ema. Maria made our cookie dough to make "Ema cookies" to also send home.





Shavuot Celebration: We made baskets for our "bikkurim," first fruits. Students filled the baskets with fresh fruit and vegetables brought from home. We marched, baskets in hand, in "50-Days-of-the-Omer" steps from our classrooms to the sanctuary. We laid our "offerings" on the Bimah, as a reminder of the offerings brought to the Levites in Temple times. Later in the

day, the fresh food was donated to Beautiful Feet, a ministry that feeds the needy every day. We also made Ten Commandments cookies and studied the Ten Commandments. Can you name the Ten Commandments? If you can't remember all of them ask one of our students.

<u>Last Day of School:</u> Again, we marched to the sanctuary in 50 steps. This time, each step represented a review question from material learned throughout the year. Students won prizes for their answers. Students also received end-of-the-year awards and teacher appreciation was shown by all.

In addition, our oldest grade's students prepared short Torah readings to read out of the Torah. Our younger grades got to peek in the Torah and find a letter or word they know. We ended the year by celebrating Torah and each other.

Help us grow the school! If you know any families with pre-school through middle-school-age children, we have a program for them. Hebrew for speaking, Judaica and Torah stories, Tefillah and song, and much more! Real Jewish content taught with common sense, content, and kindness.

ANNUAL CONGREGATIONAL MEETING INFORMATION

The amendments listed on this page detail proposed changes to the bylaws coming before the Annual Meeting on June 6. The intent of sharing these in the bulletin is for you to review the documents. The CAS Constitution and By-Laws will be sent with your meeting Zoom information. It will be the full document with the red letter changes tracked on the side so you can review how these amendments fit into the document as a whole.

Article VI Amendment reflects the suggested changes from the Nominating Committee to reduce the size of the Board of Directors beginning in 2022. Basically, the reduction is by one VP and from 15 directors to 11 directors, with 9 three-year terms and 2 one-year terms (coincide with President's term).

Article IX Amendment reflects the suggested changes from the Audit Committee to alter the Audit process to best utilize our funds and to review key portions annually rather than conduct a full audit every three years. This will take effect in 2021.

Proposed CAS By-Law Amendments

ARTICLE VI Officers and Directors

Section 1. Officers of the Congregation shall consist of a President, a 1st Vice President, a 2nd Vice President, a Secretary, a Treasurer, and the Immediate Past President whose terms shall be for one year each. The immediate Past President will serve a second successive term if the incumbent President is re-elected. After having served as Immediate Past President, he must remain off the Board of Directors for at least one year.

Section 2. Directors.

The Board of Directors shall consist of the above six officers, the current Presidents of the Ladies Auxiliary and Men's Club, and eleven directors, three of whom shall be elected each year for a three-year term, and two of whom shall be appointed by the President for a term of one year. (The Presidents of the Men's Club and Ladies Auxiliary may designate one individual to serve for the entire year in their place.)

Section 5. The two Directors appointed by the President to serve for one year cannot be re-appointed, but are eligible for election to a regular three year term. After a Director has served an elected term, he cannot be re-elected as a Director without the lapse of at least one full year off the Board, nor can he be appointed by the President to serve as a Director during this year, but he is eligible to be elected as an Officer for which he meets the requirements.

Article IX, Section 9, is hereby amended in its entirety as follows:

The Audit Committee shall consist of five members, all of whom shall be members of the Congregation in good standing. Two of the five members shall be the Treasurer and the 1st Vice President. The remaining three members do not have to be Board members, but shall be appointed by the President.

The Audit Committee shall perform all the following duties, to wit:

- a) Review all financial matters pertaining to the finances of the Congregation, including having unencumbered access to all requested financial records of the Congregation, including but not limited to all restricted and unrestricted funds, trusts and Endowments; and said Audit Committee shall make any and all recommendations of their findings, in writing, to the Board of Directors;
- b) Engage, with the approval of the Board of Directors, an independent Certified Public Accounting firm to perform selected audit procedures, the scope and magnitude of which to be determined by the Audit Committee, no less than annually; and
- c) Perform such other duties as may be assigned to it by the Board of Directors.

Any conflict between this amended Article IX, Section 9, and any other sections or Articles of the Constitution and By-Laws shall be resolved in favor of this amended Article IX, Section 9.

THINK ABOUT YOUR HEALTH

According to the updated CDC guidelines as of May 13, 2021, those who are fully vaccinated (two weeks following their 2nd dose of the Pfizer, Moderna, or Astra-Zeneca COVID vaccination, or two weeks following their one dose of the J & J/Janssen COVID vaccination) may safely resume most activities done prior to the pandemic without wearing a mask. Exceptions are hospitals and health care facilities, public transportation and public transportation hubs/depots, jails/prisons, and homeless shelters. Those who are not fully vaccinated should remain masked indoors.

Gov. Greg Abbott issued Executive Order GA-34 effective March 10, 2021, lifting some of the restrictions, but he encouraged continued social distancing. CAS requires continued social distancing (6 ft from those outside your household).

Here are the new guidelines to enter the building:

- No temperature check is required.
- Unvaccinated and those not fully vaccinated are required to wear a mask that covers the nose and mouth. Fully vaccinated persons may opt to wear masks according to their comfort levels. No mask is required for those two weeks following the final COVID vaccination (see above).
- Distancing is required indoors. We will continue to keep six feet from those living outside your household while you are indoors.
- We ask that you continue to sign in (according to current hallachick guidelines regarding the pandemic, Rabbi Bloom gives dispensation) so that we have contact tracing should a COVID case appear.

We are glad to have you back in person for services and activities. Know how much we value you and the community we share.

Please remain home if you are experiencing any COVID-19 symptoms. Please use your best judgement in following the guidelines from the CDC. It is our responsibility to ensure the safety of all.

ON SITE SERVICES INFORMATION

We're looking forward to seeing everyone as we phase into in-person meetings at CAS. At the same time, we want to ensure that we do this as safely and cautiously as is needed to protect human life by not spreading COVID-19.

WHAT TO EXPECT



CLEANING: Cleaning and sanitizing will occur prior to and following Minyan and Shabbat services in the Barnett Sanctuary. Bathrooms will be cleaned daily with additional surface cleaning during Shabbat services.

FACE MASKS: Unvaccinated and those not fully vaccinated are required to wear a mask that covers the nose and mouth. Fully vaccinated persons may opt to wear masks



according to their comfort levels. No mask is required for those two weeks following the final COVID vaccination (details in the "Think About Your Health" section).

PEWS: Every third row is open. Please sit only as a household family unit with three seats between you and the next family unit.



ARRIVAL: When you arrive, please enter through the north doors. You are asked to use hand sanitizer at the door. You will register your attendance (in case a COVID-19 case arises). **EXITING:** Visiting with your friends and family is encouraged **OUTSIDE**

the building.
