Adam and Annie Ostrinsky traveled to Israel in June to celebrate their Bar and Bat Mitzvah. It was truly the trip of a lifetime.

Every day we experienced something new and incredible. We went to the Western Wall to greet Shabbat, experiencing the incredible energy of Jerusalem and its people. We visited Ir David, where we wandered through the carefully preserved archeological excavations, including the water tunnels. We climbed to the top of Masada and reimagined the life and the last stand of Jews against the Roman armies. Adam and Annie loved taking an unsinkable swim and floating in the salty waters of the Dead Sea. We learned of the tragic stories and the horror of the Holocaust in Yad Vashem's incredibly detailed exhibits. We went to the top of the Golan Heights, exploring Syrian army fortifications and learning the importance of this area to the defenses of Israel. We saw the opulence of Caesarea, exploring its palaces. We went on an excavation in the caves of Tel Maresh and more.



This trip was truly incredible. However, the highlight was celebrating B'nai Mitzvah at the Kotel. This was a dream come true for Adam and Annie. As we stood at the Kotel near Robinson's arch, surrounded by the ancient stones, the bright blue Jerusalem sky, and the atmosphere of history of our holy traditions, this day took on a deeper significance. It was incredible to see these kids put on the tallit and read from the Torah as they were transitioning into adulthood, accepting their obligations, and promising to live according to Jewish Law.

Dear Friends,

What is the most essential characteristic of a human being? While we could debate this question, I believe that one of the best answers to this question was

given by George Washington in 1790, who said, "a good moral character is the first essential in a man. It is therefore highly important that you should endeavor not only to be learned but virtuous."

As we can see, Washington emphasized the duality of "learning" and "virtue." Learning without virtue is merely knowledge, and virtue without learning is mere instinct. The combination of the two together equates to what God commanded us to do from the time of creation: that being to both "learn" and "do" (Exodus 24:7). Consequently, if we want to live lives of consequence and morality, let us listen and carry out what God and George taught us.

Additionally we must also realize all too many of us believe that we have the answers to how others must change, what they should believe, and how they must act. For only if they change, according to our desires, will they be worthy of living. Judaism doesn't see life in this manner. One must "first mend yourself, and then mend others" (Jewish Proverb).

In other words, instead of blaming the world for our troubles and travails while at the same time trying to force others to change, the most expedient and fruitful path to take is to mend our ways before demanding others do the same. We can't stop violence with violent behavior or root out anger by being angry. In the end, "every minute you are angry, you lose sixty seconds of happiness." Thereby, let us start working on ourselves before trying to change everyone else. Consequently, when we accomplish this, our moral character will grow or, in the words of Ted Lasso, "Be curious, not judgmental."

Rosh Hodesh

Rosh Hodesh is marked each month, and the new month of Av is quickly approaching. I am reminded of a story from the Talmud, which relates to us; "Rabbi Yossi, the son of Rabbi Hanina, said: God proclaimed, 'If only my children would think of me like they think of dessert at the end of a meal!' Rabbi Yudan said: it is like a servant of the king who gave a party for all of his friends without inviting his master, the king. The king, deeply hurt, bemoaned, 'If' only my servant would treat me at least as well as he treats his friends!' So says the Holy One Blessed be He: 'If only they would yearn for me as they look forward to dessert at the end of a meal. But instead, "you have not called upon Me, Jacob"—you work hard all day long without tiring, but when it comes time to pray to me you are too tired, so that when your friend calls you to pray, you answer, "I am too tired.""

From this Talmudic story, we can learn that we often spend too much time worrying about superficial worries and our "tiredness" rather than what is important.

So, what can we do about our over-worrying and underprioritizing? The answer to this can be found in direct correlation to Rosh Hodesh, for in the Book of Samuel we read. "And David said to Yehonatan, Behold, tomorrow is the new moon, and I should not fail to sit with the king at the meal" (I Samuel 20:5).

In other words, it is time to find the "meals" (good and positive things) in our lives and make them our priorities over the excuses of "tiredness" that keep us from ful-filling our potential.

Let me wish everyone a Rosh Hodesh Tov. (A good, new month.)
