FROM OUR RABBI

Dear Friends,

The High Holy Days, Rosh Hashanah, and Yom Kippur are upon us. During this season of

reflection and tshuvah, I am reminded of a quote by Rabbi Yisrael Salanter, who said, "As long as the candle is still burning, it is still possible to accomplish and to mend."

It is in this light that there is a fable concerning Rabbi Salanter. It tells the story that one night, Rabbi Salanter was walking home past the home of a shoemaker, and despite it being extremely late, he observed the shoemaker was still busy, working by the light of a single candle. "Why are you still working?" Rabbi Salanter asked him. "It is very late, and soon the candle will go out." The shoemaker replied, "As long as the candle is still burning, it is still possible to accomplish and to mend shoes."

In other words, it is never too late to change our ways and mend our shoes (souls). This is true not only on Rosh Hashanah and in the lead-up to Yom Kippur, as there is a period in between called, The 10 Days of Teshuvah/ Repentance.

These 10 Days of Repentance (Aseret Yamei Teshuvah) are the 10 days between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. The notion of this period can be traced back over 1500 years when the rabbis of the Talmud said that this phase of time is when "the gates of heaven are open, and I (God) will listen to your prayers." In other words, God is close at hand and waiting for us to change our ways. This theological principle can be traced back to the Book of Isaiah, whereby the prophet wrote, "Seek God when He may be found; call Him when He is close" (Isaiah 55:6). These 10 days between inscription and sealing of our names in the Book of Life is critical and thus the emphasis on the period between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur.

The question we must ask ourselves is, what can we do during these 10 days for the inscription of our names to become permanently sealed in B'Sefer Hayim/The Book of Life? According to Maimonides, "it is customary for all of Israel to give profusely to charity, perform many good deeds, and be occupied with observance of God's commandments from Rosh Hashanah until Yom Kippur to a greater extent than during the remainder of the year" (Mishna Torah, Laws of Teshuvah 3:4).

While this is a great path for these 10 days, I would like to suggest that if we followed this prescription during the other 355 days a year, we would not only be sealing our names in the Book of Life, but we would also be inspiring society to follow suit.

Thereby ensuring a better life for all both within our books as well as among the codices of the world.

At the culmination of these 10 days, we transition into the Kol Nidre and Yom Kippur services. Our goal after observing Rosh Hashanah and looking within ourselves for 10 days should be based upon the wise words of Rabbi Marc D. Angel, who said, "We should not be the same person the day after Yom Kippur that we were the day before Yom Kippur. We should be moving ahead, raising our lives to a higher level."

Without a doubt, these are powerful words to reflect upon and live by. Consequently, let us use this holiest of days of the year and the intermediary days of introspection to meditate on the past, change our ways in the present and move forward into the future as better human beings than we were when we started. Incorporating these lessons into our lives is the embodiment of living a life of mitzvoth. Thus, ensuring that 5783 will be a holy and blessed year.

In a combined Situational Awareness and Active Threat Mitigation training featuring highlights from both, followed by a series of practical, hands-on exercises, we will experience the important moments that prepare us for day-to-day situations as well as High Holy Days.
