# FROM OUR RABBI

A.B. Yehoshua (1936-2022) was an Israeli author, essayist, and ideological thinker. He was considered by many to be Israel's

James Faulkner. Among Yehoshua's many books, he wrote, "The most difficult and complicated part of the writing process is the beginning."

This quote is true about life in general. The first step towards building a new future, starting down a new path, or even becoming friends with a stranger, begins by taking a chance. In other words, putting ourselves out there. However, how do we know when to take that first step? We don't! We need to take it and put our trust in "the Lord, maker of heaven and earth" (Psalm 121:2) and ourselves. If we don't move forward, life will simply pass us by. However, the question is, if we don't want life to pass us by, in what direction do we head? I believe that the following story can shed some light on our question.

The story tells us three weary refugees stood before the Paris representative of a relief agency. "Where are you all going?" he asked them. "I'm on my way to Rome," said the first. "London is my destination," said the second. "My plan is to go to South Africa," said the third. "South Africa? Why so far?" the representative asked wonderingly. "Far? Far from where?" wistfully countered the refugee (Adapted from A Treasury of Jewish Folklore).

The title of this story, "The Relativity of Distance," without a doubt, is appropriate. However, it is appropriate for much more than just this parable. For, it is a lesson in perspective and thinking. Only when we put aside our prejudices and preconceptions; can we understand other individuals' situations and realities. Once we can accomplish this, the schism between what is believed and what actually is begins to shrink thereby, building a bridge to commonality, allowing each to walk his/her own path in life without judgment or preconceptions.

On top of this, let us remember that in Jewish Mysticism/Kabbalah, we are taught, "With each experience, we grow and become more aware of the inner beauty that lies within us.

Ultimately, we are truly our own leaders/trail-blazers. We lead the connection and flow of life that is our inheritance." While this beautiful and philosophical quote is deep on so many levels, it boils down to the inner spirit within ourselves. In other words, our journeys in life continue to grow and reveal themselves throughout our lives. So, where we are now is not where we will soon be; we will have experienced life and have grown. Thus, we must constantly be aware of life, for only through this will we meet and grow our inner beauty. Thereby, we must listen to A.B. Yehoshua and think of every experience as a beginning, not an end.

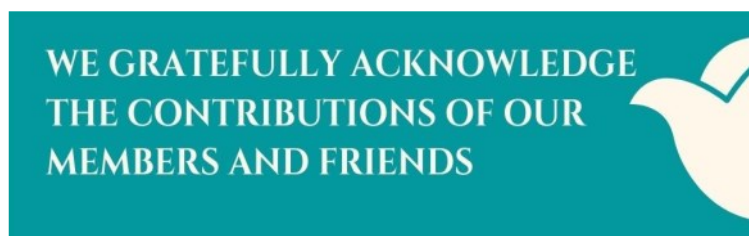

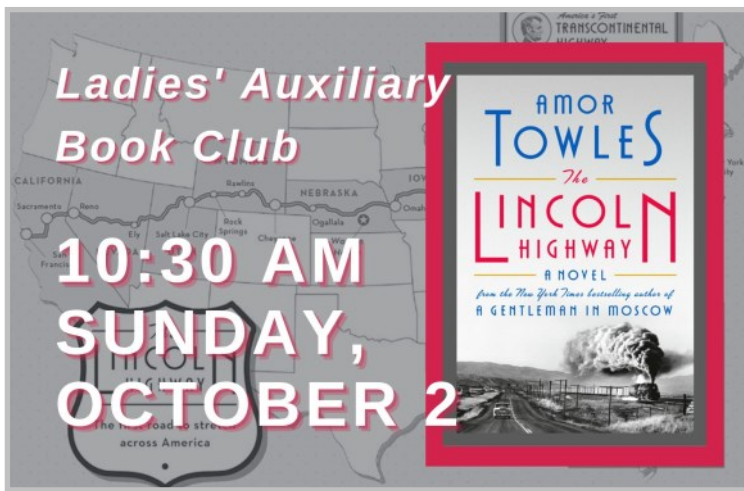


## PROJECT ISAIAH

The Torah commands us:
