One of the goals of the LEC is to provide students with the context of being Jewish, past and present, by marking and reflecting on Jewish historical events and understanding what they mean to us today, as individuals and as a community.

As such, the Jewish month of Shevat came and went with a cold weather snap, but we took the time to celebrate the beautiful Jewish holiday of nature's renewal - Tu B'shevat.

We held a festive ceremony – the Tu-B'shevat Seder, that included a meal featuring fruits representing God's promised abundance of the land of Israel. The students later continued to plant parsley seeds to get ready for the Passover Seder, and prepared bird feeders which they hung on the trees at the congregation in preparation for our own nature's renewal here in Texas.

As I write these words for you to read, we were at the start of the Jewish month of Adar which is the month we celebrate Purim. Traditionally, Adar is considered the most joyous month in the Hebrew calendar, as we read Esther's Megillah and remember how the life of every Jew in the empire of Persia was spared. Thus, Adar's motto is, "When Adar comes around, happiness abounds".

As any occasion is a good reason for a celebration, we at the LEC planned a fun, school-wide Purim celebration.

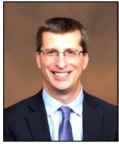

Leviticus 25, Torah and the Sabbatical!

“Torah is not education, it's transformation.” (Rebbitzen Dena Weinberg)

From this we can understand, that in order to transform one's religious life one must embrace the study of religion and our sources. I think the same can be sure about our lives, our professions and our interests. For if we want to improve ourselves, then we need to learn, read and understand the rich history of educational literature and knowledge that is out there waiting for us to grasp onto.

It is in this light, that Rabbis over the centuries have taken Sabbaticals based upon the Torahitic Sabbatical (7-year cycle of the resting of the land – Chapter 25 in Leviticus) Personally, I will be taking a 3-month sabbatical that CAS and I agreed to 7 years ago. This sabbatical will take place between the end of March and Mid July. I look forward to this transformative family, educational, cultural, and religious experiences that I will experience during this time. During these months, I am looking forward to taking a part of the culture of CAS and Fort Worth with me as this is my home and at the same time coming back to the shul as we prepare for the High Holy Days and the new LEC year. For the education out in the world that Rebbitzen Weinberg wrote about, will be brought back home as well.

In terms of Judaic growth as I mentioned above, transformation, is not something that will suddenly come upon us, rather it comes through personal growth. There is a traditional Judaism teaching, that says “more Torah more life” In other words, the more we embrace God and the knowledge that He bestowed upon us, the more and better our lives

will be. I have no doubt that all of us will continue to grasp onto more Torah for this is ever evolving and our lives. I look forward to sharing both of our growths upon my return.

In the end, I know that we can all agree that God is holy and sacred. This being true, even though religions throughout the world can't agree and hold different theological definitions and ideas as to the substantive meaning of God. According to Abraham Maslow, who wrote “Maslow's Pyramid, “The sacred is in the ordinary...it is to be found in one's daily life, in one's neighbors, friends, and family, in one's own backyard...To be looking elsewhere for miracles is to me a sure sign of ignorance that everything is miraculous.” In other words, the sacred is around us at all times, we just need to change our perceptions in order to find it. I hope that we will continue to realize this, for growth is not dependent on time or location. Abraham Joshua Heschel, called this “Radical Amazement.” Thereby, instead of just looking towards the heavens to find God and the Holy, we can do that by finding God's sacredness all around us and within each other. Upon my return, I know that the Radical Amazement that God affords us will be with each of us as individuals and together as a community. May God bless us all in the months to come.

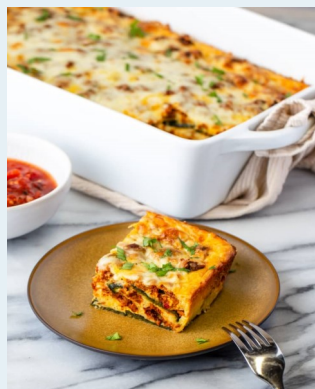

March Recipe From Maria

Chile Relleno Casserole

- 2 Large Poblano, or Anaheim or 2 cans chopped chilies
- 1 1/2 C. shredded Monterey jack
- 3 eggs slightly beaten
- 1/4 C milk
- 1/3 C all purpose flour
- 1/2 tsp baking powder
- 1/4 tsp cayenne pepper
- 1/8 tsp salt

Pre heat oven 450 degrees, grease 2 qt. dish, chopped peppers (charred steamed first) in the dish, 1/2 the cheese..
Bowl, combine the eggs, flour, milk, pepper, salt, everything until smooth.

Bake uncovered 15-20 min, knife should come out clean, sprinkle cheese on t op, should be puffed up and golden brown.

Serve with salsa, crème fresch, sour cream, guacamole, etc.



Chag Purim Same'ach

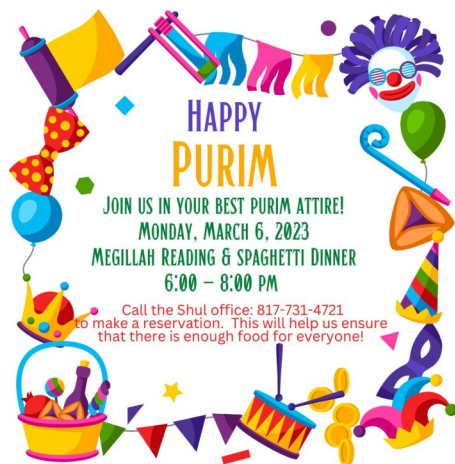
