

Apple Matzo Kugel

- 4 Matzo Sheets
- 3 eggs, beaten
- 1/2 teaspoon of salt
- 1/2 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup vegetable oil
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 2 apples-peeled, cored and cubed
- 1/2 cup raisins



Directions:

Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F. Grease an 8x8 inch baking dish. Break the matzo sheets into pieces, and soak in a bowl of water until soft. Drain in a colander, mashing to squeeze the water out.

In a separate bowl, mix together the eggs, salt, sugar, oil and cinnamon. Add the soaked matzo and mix well. Fold in the apples and raisins. Spoon into the prepared baking dish, and spread evenly.

Bake for 45 minutes in the preheated oven, until nicely browned and apples are tender.

Dear Friends. David Ben Gurion, first prime minister of the State of Israel. described the importance of the memories preserved on Pesach as he argued for the right to a Jewish State in 1947. "Three hundred years ago a ship called the Mayflower set sail to the New World. This was a greatest event in the history of England. Yet I wonder if there is one Englishman who knows at what time the ship set sail? Do the English know how many people embarked on this voyage? What quality of bred id they eat? Yet more than three thousand three hundred years ago, before the Mayflower set sail, the Jews left Egypt. Every Jew in the world, even in America or Soviet Russia knows on exactly what date they left-the fifteenth of the month of Nisan; everyone knows what kind of bread the Jews ate. Even today the Jews worldwide eat matza on the 15th of Nisan. They retell the story of the Exodus and all the troubles Jews have endured since being exiled. They conclude this evening with two statements: This year, slaves. Next year, free men. This year here. Next year in Jerusalem, in Zion, in Eretz Yisrael. That is the

As we can see, the holiday of Passover is one of redemption, as it tells the story of the Israelites transformation from slavery to freedom. The Exodus from Egypt turned the Israelites bitterness of slavery into the sweetness of freedom.

nature of the Jews."

It is in this light, that when I prepare to sit around the Seder table, I am

reminded of the words of Rabbi Nachman of Breslove (1722-1810) who frequently said that, "The Exodus from Egypt occurs in every human being, in every era, in every year, and in every day." Thereby, while the retelling of the story of the Exodus from Egypt is central to Passover, let us also remember that we must celebrate our daily Exodus's and help ensure that we, and others, will never again be "avidim/slaves" but rather always remain "B'nai Chorin/free people."

On behalf of myself, Michal and our family, we would like to wish everyone the traditional blessing of a Chag Kasher V'Samech. A Sweet and Kosher Passover.
