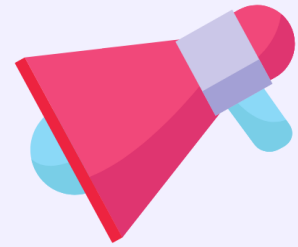

Israel at 75: Deep in the Heart of Fort Worth; Golden Book, Crafted in 1926, on Display

The Golden Book of Donors, with its cover of ivory and brass and parchment pages binded in Jerusalem in 1926, was among the priceless artifacts displayed at “Deep in the Heart: Israel at 75,” a monthlong exhibit at Congregation Ahavath Sholom celebrating Israel’s jubilee year.

The Golden Book was commissioned nearly a century ago by the Fort Worth Talmud Torah at a cost of \$500. (That’s \$8,300 in today’s dollars.) Donors who wanted their names inscribed in the Golden Book contributed \$250 to the Hebrew school. The current cost of an inscription is **\$300** – a bargain considering inflation. The book was crafted at Jerusalem’s Bezalel School of Arts and Crafts.

Also on display were vintage photos from Texas Zionist Association conferences that convened in Fort Worth and in Dallas in 1906 and 1907. Many of the delegates were local pioneers of Zionism. They envisioned a new Jewish homeland on ancient soil long before it caught the imagination of the general public or the attention of the United Nations.

In fact, in March of 1948, eight weeks before Israel declared its independence, the Jewish Federation in Fort Worth received an emergency request from the United Jewish Appeal asking for a cash infusion of \$100,000. With minimal discussion, the Federation board, chaired by Sol Federation meeting are part of the current exhibit. Brachman, voted to borrow the money from the Fort Worth National Bank. The minutes of that Federation meeting are part of the current exhibit.

These little-known facts and other rarely seen artifacts were part of the “Deep in the Heart” exhibit curated by the Fort Worth Jewish Archives. The exhibit included postcards of Israel from the 1950s and the 1980s; a 28-minute video of Rabbi Bob Schur’s 1954 UJA mission trip to Israel; and a 12-minute slide show of color snapshots from

recent visits to Eretz Yisrael by Tarrant County residents.

The exhibit opened April 30 with a 75th birthday party and Israeli luncheon attended by more than 200 people and sponsored by the Jewish Federation of Fort Worth and Tarrant County. Activities included a trivia contest and scavenger hunt. Those with advance reservations received a free T-shirt with a “Deep in the Heart” logo.

The Israeli exhibit remained at Ahavath Sholom through the end of May. In June it moved across the street to Beth-El Congregation. The Golden Book, however, remains at the shul. It is now outside the library, across the hall from the Chapel. Be sure to take a look. The exhibit includes a facsimile of the book that you can examine, page-by-page, and an alphabetical listing of each name inscribed within it.

Also remaining at Ahavath Sholom is a showcase in the foyer artfully arranged with anniversary posters from years past; 15 ancient clay oil lamps on loan from Beth-El; vintage tzedekah boxes, including one in Yiddish; brass artifacts and sand paintings.

Our daughter's names are engraved in bricks that are planted in the ground at the Sukkah Pavilion. And this is the place where I have met and see some of my closest friends. Ultimately this place means a lot to my family and me and that is why I said yes to Rich.

And recently, after I agreed to throw my name in the presidential kippa, words cannot describe the humble feeling I have had as I have received the most wonderful voicemail messages, e-mails and text messages of support from our congregants and community leaders. I have been overwhelmed by the outward support already shown by so many of you. Also thank you to Jen, Sydney, and

Samantha, and thank you to Mark and Naomi for your support, and thank you all in advance for whatever is to come out of this!

One might think that after thousands of years we would have everything figured out by now regarding how to run a Shul, but there's a lot of work that goes on every week and there's much for us to do. And I am thrilled that we have Cantor Dorman starting with us full-time beginning in August, he's a fantastic addition to our team with Rabbi Bloom!

CAS is your home as much as it is mine. It's an extremely dynamic place when energized people want to make things happen. I encourage all of you to step forward to become more involved. When our committees do something, they always punch above their weight and it's great to be working along-side of them, we would be in a lot of trouble without our volunteers. That stated, thank you to Dan, Marti, Karen, Sabrina, and Foster for volunteering to serve on our executive board with me, and thank you to all of the members of the Board, and all of our committee chairs and committee members, and our other volunteers, as well as Rabbi Bloom, Cantor Dorman, Angyl, Suzi, Fani, our Sunday school teachers, Maria, and Gabriel.

I have a call to action, a request for each and every one of you. Our committees and Board can do only so much, and many of our volunteers have been doing this since before the doors to this building were opened in 1980, which at the time I was just 9 years old. In order to keep CAS going, we need our younger members to get more involved and work with our more "seasoned" volunteers. What are YOU going to do to help make CAS the Shul you want it to be? What recommendations can YOU

make to our committees and help them engage our existing and potential members? Even better, what committee would you like to join?

I will conclude with this, a very heartfelt thank you to Foster for volunteering as President the past 2 years and leading us out of the pandemic, and a sincere thank you as well to Rich, Rebecca, Jodi, Josh, Arthur, and Tatyana for your time on our Board. And thank you and welcome to our Board Tony, Yevgeniy, Laurie, and Danny. Thank you all for placing your trust in me to be President of Congregation Ahavath Sholom!

The following is a message from the Galagnov Family:

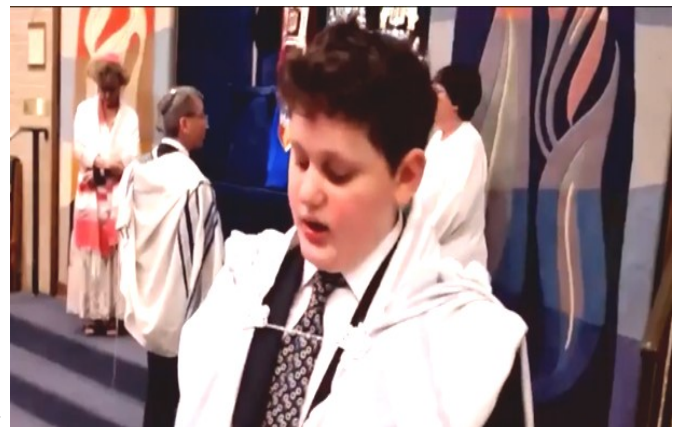
Misha and I were so happy to be able to celebrate our son, Yair Lev, having reached the age of Bar Mitzvah on June 3rd, with our community, friends, and extended family. He attended the b'not mitzvah of his sisters, and was very excited to have his turn.

While Yair Lev took his role in the services seriously, his work was made easier by the fact that he was a child who grew up in shul, primarily this one. Each week we would come, and Yair Lev and his sisters would hear and join in the prayers that became as familiar to them as nursery school songs are to others. For Yair Lev, being in synagogue is as natural and comfortable as being at home.

Yair Lev was born on Lag Ba'omer, a holiday often celebrated by building bonfires. Misha and I chose the name Yair Lev, which means "will illuminate the heart," and Yair Lev does that for us and for those whom he meets. We also liked the name Lev because it is close to Liev, the Russian word for Lion.

Yair Lev has always been very much his own person. When he was in pre-k, Yair Lev had a lion costume he absolutely loved. Yair wore it everywhere: to shul, the zoo, and leaping into the classroom with a roar. Of course, eventually Yair Lev outgrew the costume, but he retained his sense of fun and adventure.

Yair Lev has grown since then, from the child I could carry on one hip. Now when we go to shul together, I have to look up to him. And he helps me find the place when I have gotten lost, not the other way around. Of course, while we are very proud of how far Yair Lev has come, both as a person and as a Jew, there are so many people who contributed to his Jewish education, both directly and indirectly. We are grateful to the people who have been members of the community throughout Yair's life, and to those who took the time to spend Shabbat morning with us. And we are grateful to those who came before us. We are each of us a product of the seeds that were planted, and the earth in which we grew. 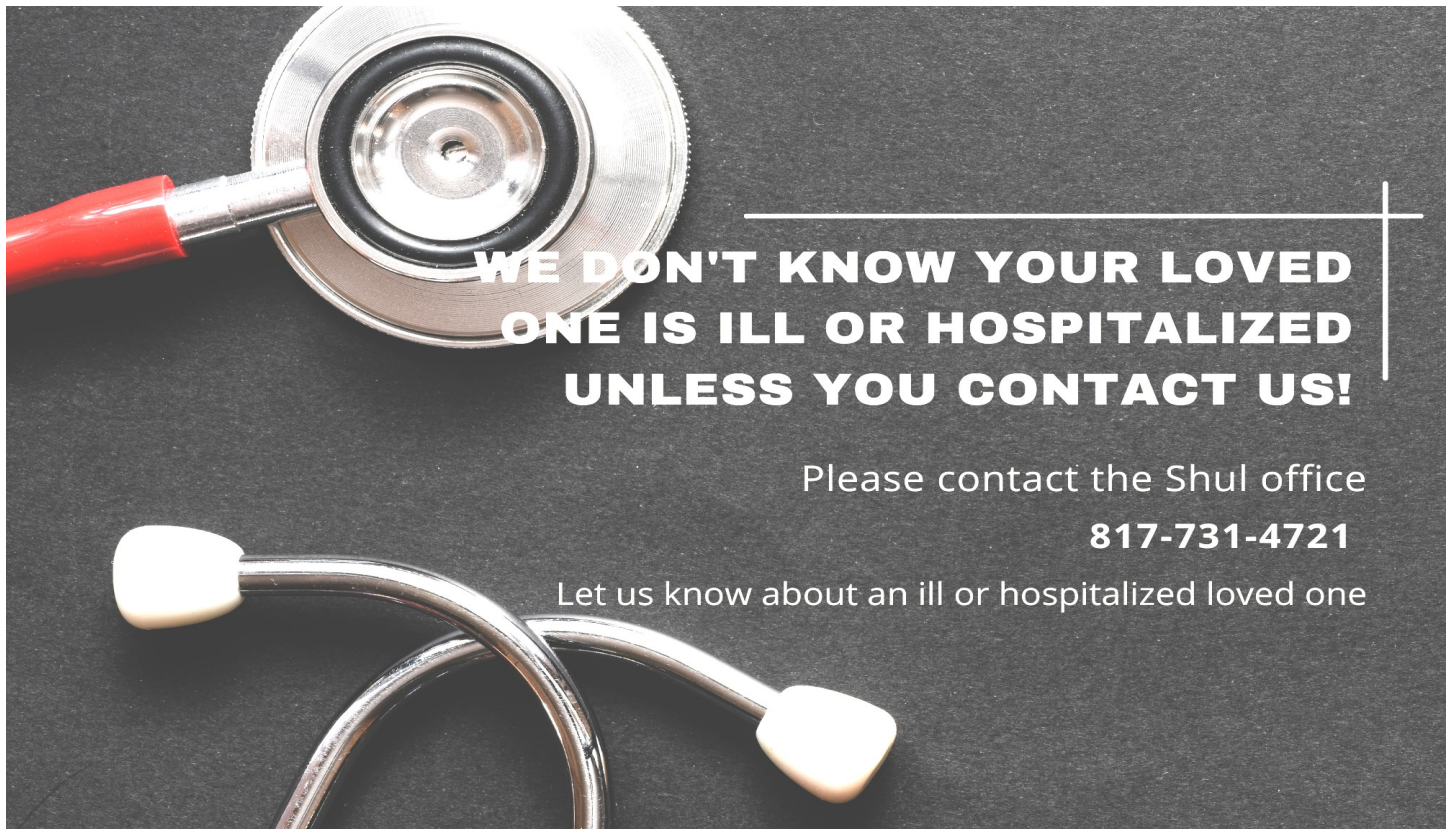


