Dear Friends,

Years ago, Berel Gartner shared one of the most remarkable stories ever told on BBC radio. His own. Recently a clip of Rabbi YY Jacobson retelling this story was circling the social channels.

When Berel Gartner was 12 before World War II, he was one of the children who left Germany through the Kinder-transport. He arrived in England and was taken to an orphanage. He spent most of his days crying and asking his caregivers when he would see his parents again. As hard as they tried to make him happy, he could not be consoled.

One day, Berel's caregivers found out that King George VI would be passing through their village, as he frequently did during the early years of his reign. When they told Berel that they would be seeing the king pass by that day, it was the first time in weeks that he stopped crying. Berel had a secret plan.

The other Jewish children were taken to the town square and stood behind a barricade as they waited for the king to pass by. As the royal carriage came closer, Berel jumped the barricade and ran with all of his might towards the king's carriage. As soon as the royal guards saw him, they grabbed him and carried him back to the barricade. The king asked his guards what was going on. When they told him about the boy who ran towards his carriage, he invited Berel to come closer.

The king asked Berel, "Why did you run towards the carriage? Is there something you would like to tell me?" Berel broke down crying and told the king how much he missed his parents who were still back in Germany. He then wiped the tears and said, "Please. Please help bring my parents here."

King George responded, "Young boy, we are at war with Germany. It would be impossible for me to do that."

"But you're the king of England!" Berel cried. "You can do anything! Please bring my parents to me." The king looked at the boy with compassion and said, "Please don't cry. I promise I will do what I can to try and make it happen."

Berel gave the king his parents' names and thanked him, unsure of what to expect.

A month later, there was a knock at the door of the orphanage. Berel's parents had arrived. Somehow, they were brought out of Germany and were reunited with their son.



As President of Congregation Ahavath Sholom, my top priority is your safety and I am extremely pleased that on September 6th and 7th we will have people in our Shul from the Secure Community Network (they are like the Jewish FBI) teaching classes on Greeter Training, Counteracting Active Threats, and Stop the Bleed. We have tried to make these classes as accommodating as possible for you to attend, the classes are 10:00-11:30AM and 7:00-8:30PM on both days and the specific schedule for each class is in this bulletin. I cannot overstate that the information presented will be invaluable for you. Even the greeter training, although you might not ever be a greeter, is extremely useful information for you to be alert and aware. Hopefully you never have to use the skills presented in these classes, but whether you are in a mall, a movie theater, or anywhere out and about, the information provided could save your life or the lives of others and I encourage you to contact our office to sign up. The classes are free and snacks and refreshments will be provided. You can read the next paragraph of my article after you call 817-731-4721 and let Angyl or Jessie show up to do the work! However, if you are not already know to expect you.

Now that you have signed up for the SCN classes...throughout the rest of September, we are packed with other great programs, as well as the return of Cantor Pablo Duek, AKA "The Rockin' Cantor" for Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur. Cantor Duek was booked with us prior to hiring Cantor Dorman, and Cantor Dorman was also booked with another congregation prior to his engagement with us, so everything works out well for everyone! Additionally, this year for Yom Kippur we are changing things up a bit and instead of bringing donations for the food bank, we are collecting food and monetary donations for Everman Animal Control and Saving Hope Animal Rescue. Everman Animal Control is very small and unfortunately gets overshadowed by some of the larger shelters that get funding support in Fort Worth. Both organizations are in desperate need of puppy and kitten food, as well as milk replacement formula for puppy and kitten bottle feeding. Please consider bringing pet food or a check made out to Everman Animal Control or Saving Hope when you come for Kol Nidre services at 7:00PM on Sunday, September 24th.

Transitioning back to Ahavath Sholom, I want to thank Maria for 25 years of service and preparing great food and events for us! As the only kosher commercial kitchen in Tarrant County, it's not easy to be aware of all of the laws of Kashrut, and Maria works very hard for all of us each week to serve us something not quite as heavy as cholent! We had a very nice kiddish luncheon to honor her last month, and a big thank you to Rhonda Krupp and her catering committee for organizing the event, as well as Rich and Terri Hollander for all of their efforts in preparing the food, and also the many people who donated to the kiddish luncheon in Maria's honor.

Whether it's donating time or money, whenever people come up to me and ask how my term is going, I always tell them that I am simply amazed by our volunteers. Events like the luncheon for Maria don't happen overnight, it takes an incredible amount of effort from our family of families, but it's more than just the

luncheons. We have involvement in many different areas from our volunteers. Last month a lot of people came together to help convert the computer lab into Cantor Dorman's new office. Arthur Moses, the Bearden family, Foster Owen, Chad and Marti Herman, Suzie Herman, Jim Stansbury, Joe Mintz, Reuben Ramirez, Dan Sturman, and our janitor Gabriel (hopefully I captured everyone) did everything from picking out paint colors, carpet, furniture that was very generously donated, painted the office, did all of the heavy lifting of moving the furniture and carpeting, changing out electrical outlets, removing the ceiling mounted projector and drop down screen, and it was a lot of work. We had so many people involved as well as more people who were on the bench that were ready to help if needed. Whether it's volunteering to be on our Board of Directors, chairing or serving on a committee, volunteering to help out for an event, or something such as transforming a computer lab to an office, when we need people, it is great to see that we have wonderful "family members" who actually involved, or if the last thing you did was bake hamantaschen in 1985 but were waiting for a call to come do something else, here is your call...we need YOU and I encourage you to help. If there is something that interests you for volunteering, I am quite certain that we have something for everyone! One of the next opportunities where you can help out is with setting up the Sukkah starting at 8:30AM on Sunday, September 10th. Please call the office to let us know we can expect you to help.

There's a lot of activity in our Shul this month and we would love to see you! Last month we had a fun Rockin' Ruach musical Shabbat that must have had over 120 people who attended, included a lot of kids, and if you were not there you will want to come to our next one. And speaking of kids, we had a great kickoff to the LEC school year at the end of August, and we are extremely grateful to our wonderful Principal, Fani, and all of the teachers and madrichim who put a lot of effort and love into teaching our next generation. And also thank you to all of the parents for enrolling your kids!

Our clergy, staff, and volunteers are all working together to make the events and services engaging and run as smoothly as possible. Article for Society for Southwest Archivists Quarterly Bulletin

Faced with hundreds of 30-year-old snapshots from the Fort Worth Hebrew Day School, two archives volunteers hit on a novel way to Identify students and stage a reunion among friends. Rebecca Isgur, former principal at the parochial school, and Sheila Stocker, the school's longtime education chair, staged an "Archives Tea."

For weeks in advance, they sorted photos by year, designed adhesive labels for the back of each print, and invited dozens of moms to drop by one afternoon last April. On tables covered with bright pink linens, scrapbooks lay open alongside magnifying glasses, pens, and sharpened pencils.

At a check-in-table, also set with a bright pink tablecloth, hostesses had poured iced tea and lemonade and set out plates of cookies alongside a vase filled with lilacs and a peach-colored iris. More than 25 guests, including a mother-daughter team, gathered at Fort Worth's Congregation Ahavath Sholom for the tea and to reminisce and to recall exactly who the children were in all those photos. They were old friends who used to see one another most every day when they were involved with launching and building a top-notch private school from the ground up.


The Fort Worth Hebrew Day School had initially operated from 1981 to May of 1989 at Congregation Ahavath Sholom. After years of fundraising through grants, galas, and auctions, in 1989 students, parents, alumni and supporters celebrated the opening of a 22,000 square-foot schoolhouse on the grounds of the Dan Danziger Jewish Community Center. The school enrolled children from kindergarten through eighth grade. Among the student body were a sprinkling of immigrants from the Soviet Union and Israeli youngsters whose parents were assigned to train at General Dynamics and later Lockheed. The school proved to be a melting pot within the Fort Worth Jewish community.

Sadly, as the Day School grew and its enrollment increased, the Jewish Community Center was losing members and operating at a deficit. Although the Day School owned its building, the road leading to it was on the JCC's property. The ailing JCC was sold in May 1999. With that, the Hebrew Day School lost its schoolhouse and its visibility. It moved back to Congregation Ahavath Sholom, but its enrollment shrank, and the school ceased operations in 2007.

When Rebecca Isgur volunteered in 2022 to spend one morning a week in the Fort Worth Jewish Archives, her special project became boxes of Hebrew Day School memorabilia, documents, yearbooks, scrapbooks, art projects, and photos. She recruited her friend Sheila Stocker, an educator who on multiple occasions has been recognized as Public School Teacher of the Year. This team is off to a good start!




