Rabbi Bloom

Dear Friends,

Yom Kippur has come to an end and with it the intense period of inner reflection that we all go through during such holy days. However, do our introspections ever end? The Chinese philosopher, Lao Tzu (6th century BCE) once said, "One cannot reflect in streaming water. Only those who know internal peace can give it to others."

While the quote on surface holds a multitude of meanings, I believe that one of those lessons that we need to remember is, that reflection never ends. For, it is only when we consistently engage in our inner examinations and growth, that peace around us and within us can flow like a beautiful stream.

Thereby, since the High Holy Days are over and our spiritual intensity has somewhat reverted back to previous levels, I would like to heighten it once again, by asking the ageless question of, where is God?

Personally, I believe that this question is misplaced, and instead we should be asking, "where isn't God located?" For we should not be trying to disprove something (God) that is not provable. Rather, we should be embracing our beliefs and looking to find God in all places and at all moments. An example of such a perspective, can be found in a book written by Arnaldo Niskier called "A Sabedoria Judaica." In this book the following story is told.

"Once a man questioned Rabbi Joshua Ben Karechah:

"Why did God choose a thorn bush to talk to Moses?"

The Rabbi answered: "If he had chosen an olive tree or a blackberry bush, you would have made the same question. But I can't let you go without an answer: that is why I say that God chose a miser and small thornbush to teach that there is no place on Earth where He isn't present."

In other words, God is everywhere, and the only instrument that we need to find Him with, is our own ability to believe. Thus, we must open ourselves up to allowing God into our lives, in even the littlest and most unlikely of places. For example, in a thornbush. Only when we can grasp the world in this manner will God be both within us and around us. Thus, our reflections will enhance and our spirituality rise.

This being our post Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur lesson. While during these three days, the weight of God is felt by us all on an intense level, we must continue to grasp His omnipotence and omnipresence in order to keep Him with us at all times. For in this manner, God will not only be with us when we enter the walls of the sanctuary, rather He will be a sanctuary among us and within us wherever we go.

Let me wish everyone a continued God embracing and enriching 5784.







A big thank you to Rabbi Bloom, Cantor Duek, the Ritual committee, and our staff for smooth Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services, and thank you to the Ladies Auxiliary and Men's Club for sponsoring a wonderful break fast. If you were not able to attend Yom Kippur services, I'd like to walk you through a very condensed version of the speech I gave to the congregation. I began by highlighting some of the many positive things that have taken place at Ahavath Sholom over the past 12 months:

- We hired Cantor Dorman, Angyl, and Jessie
- LEC is going strong and is a leading Sunday school program...thank you, Fani, teachers, and parents
- Fani, along with David and Melissa, also started a fun program on Saturdays called Ahavath Shabbat which is a shabbat program for the kids that is also funded in part by the Jewish Federation of Fort Worth and Tarrant County
- We held our first confirmation ceremony in many years and we are continuing with ongoing confirmation classes
- We have weekday daily minyan at 6:55AM
- Rhonda Krupp and her catering and programming committee, along with Maria, have put out some great food and terrific events
- One of those events was a fun 2nd night seder led by Cantor Dorman
- Rockin Ruachs have resumed at Friday night Shabbat services about once each month and we've had well over 100 adults and kids singing along at each Rockin' Ruach
- We have resumed movie night led by Debby and Todd Rice
- Mahjong games are held here every Wednesday at 1PM, and we are about to start offering Bridge and Mahjong lessons
- Just a few Sundays ago this building was hopping, it was full of activity with well over 100 people in all areas. We were building the Sukkah, LEC was in session, Cantor Dorman had his Hebrew class which will be a regular class at 10am on Sundays, Ladies Auxiliary had their book club meeting, and Marti Herman led the first gathering of the Baking Brigade
- We also have engaging classes at 6:30PM on Tuesdays with Rabbi Bloom to discuss the weekly parsha
- Behind the scenes we replaced our 10-year-old physical network server and migrated to a cloud-based server
- Our cemetery is very well kept and we also installed security cameras there this year
- And just a few weeks ago we had a great kiddush luncheon to honor Maria Loya for her 25 year anniversary working here

That's only a snapshot! The bottom line is that we have a lot going on but it also comes with a lot of expenses. Being a member of the Jewish community, there are many wonderful organizations in our local and global worlds of Jewish non-profits that all need your financial support...and I get it, you want to support everything, and it's tough to do. However, I've learned a lot over the past 4 months in this crash course of being president of CAS, and something that really stands out to me in this role is that Ahavath Sholom has an **annual budget this year of \$1,080,000**, you should be aware of that. That's what it costs to employ the staff, keep the lights on, have that nice cold air blowing through the building, provide the tasty kiddush luncheons, and on and on...a million bucks.

That stated, our dues and the contributions over and above our dues, from all of us, make a big difference. Fortunately, the elders of Ahavath Sholom were brilliant enough to set up investments and other streams of revenue, but at the end of each fiscal year it's always tight, and extremely difficult to prioritize when putting together the annual budget for the following year, what can we do vs. what we would like to do but can't afford to do.

So you say to yourself, why give? What do I get out of it? Will my money be spent wisely? Let me tell you just a few of the things that **WE** get. Congregations of our size membership in today's world do not typically have both a full time Rabbi and full time Cantor, but we do, thanks to your assistance. Most congregations don't have the fantastic programs as well as weekly kiddush luncheons with great tuna salad, egg salad, bagels, etc... And most congregations don't have anywhere close to the quality of food that Maria and our catering committee volunteers provide every week. Additionally, Ahavath Sholom has the only kosher commercial kitchen in all of Tarrant County.

Thanks to Marti Herman, Arthur Moses, Dan Sturman, and others, the grounds here at CAS as well as our cemetery look great. However, it costs a fortune to keep everything maintained well. It also takes an incredible amount of their time, and they do such a great job!

If we tithed like what's done with some of our friends where they attend church, think about what that would mean for you if we truly tithed 10% against personal gross income, for many the amount would likely be much different as compared to what is established in our dues structure...but we don't tithe. We need your dues, and if at some point in the past for whatever reason you needed a dues variance and now the variance is no longer needed, please let Suzi in our office know and adjust accordingly.

Think back to 1892 to the start of Ahavath Sholom with just a few dozen people, and all of the many volunteers who have moved this congregation forward throughout the past 131 years. Is Congregation Ahavath Sholom going to be around for the next 131 years and beyond? If it is, it's going to require all of us right here and right now, we can count on only ourselves.

In 1892, one of the other great Moseses in our history, Moses Shanblum, founder of Ahavath Sholom, who perhaps none of us knew or have a blood relationship with...all of us are tied together with Moses Shanblum as his family of families. He and the other founders paid it forward so that you could be a member of Ahavath Sholom at this very moment, whether you come just twice a year for the High Holy Days, or if your involvement is more frequent, we all share in this, and we need to do the same for our current and future members. Let's build the future of Congregation Ahavath Sholom together...today....right now! Thank you very much for your past support, and thank you very much for your support today and in the future.






